

Pathway 2 – Living Skills

Rainbow pizzas -BBC Good Food



Ingredients

- 2 plain pizza bases
- 6 tablespoons passata
- 400g mixed red and yellow tomatoes, sliced
- 75g sprouting broccoli, stems finely sliced
- 8 green olives, pitted and halved (optional)
- 150g mozzarella cherries (bocconcini)
- 2 tablespoons fresh pesto
- Handful of fresh basil leaves (to serve)

Method

1. Method Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Put each pizza base on a baking sheet and spread each with half of the passata. Arrange the tomatoes on the top in rings or wedges of colour and add the broccoli and the olives, if using. Squish the mozzarella cherries (bocconcini) a little before dotting them over the pizzas, then drizzle 1 tbsp pesto over each.
2. Bake for 15-20 mins or until the top is bubbling and just starting to brown a little. Scatter over the basil leaves before serving. Ingredients 2 plain pizza bases 6 tbsp passata 400g mixed red and yellow tomatoes, sliced 75g sprouting broccoli, stems finely sliced 8 green olives, pitted and halved (optional) 150g mozzarella cherries (bocconcini) 2 tbsp fresh pesto handful fresh basil leaves, to serve

How to make a jungle in a bowl



What you'll need

A clear glass or plastic container
Potting soil, sand
Potted plants; flowers, tree branches, leaves
Model animals, animal pictures
Pebbles, twigs, marbles

Step 1

Find a clear container – like a glass bowl, vase or jar – and place some pebbles at the bottom to create a drainage system for your jungle habitat.

Step 2

Add a layer of soil on top of the pebbles – make it deep enough to cover the plants' roots. Instead of the soil, you can use rice, sand, playdough, etc.

Step 3

Now it's time to add the plants, flowers, small tree branches, leaves.

Step 4

Make holes in the soil where you want the plants to go. When you remove the plants from their pots, gently get rid of the excess soil around the roots and place them in the holes. Press the soil down around them.

Step 5

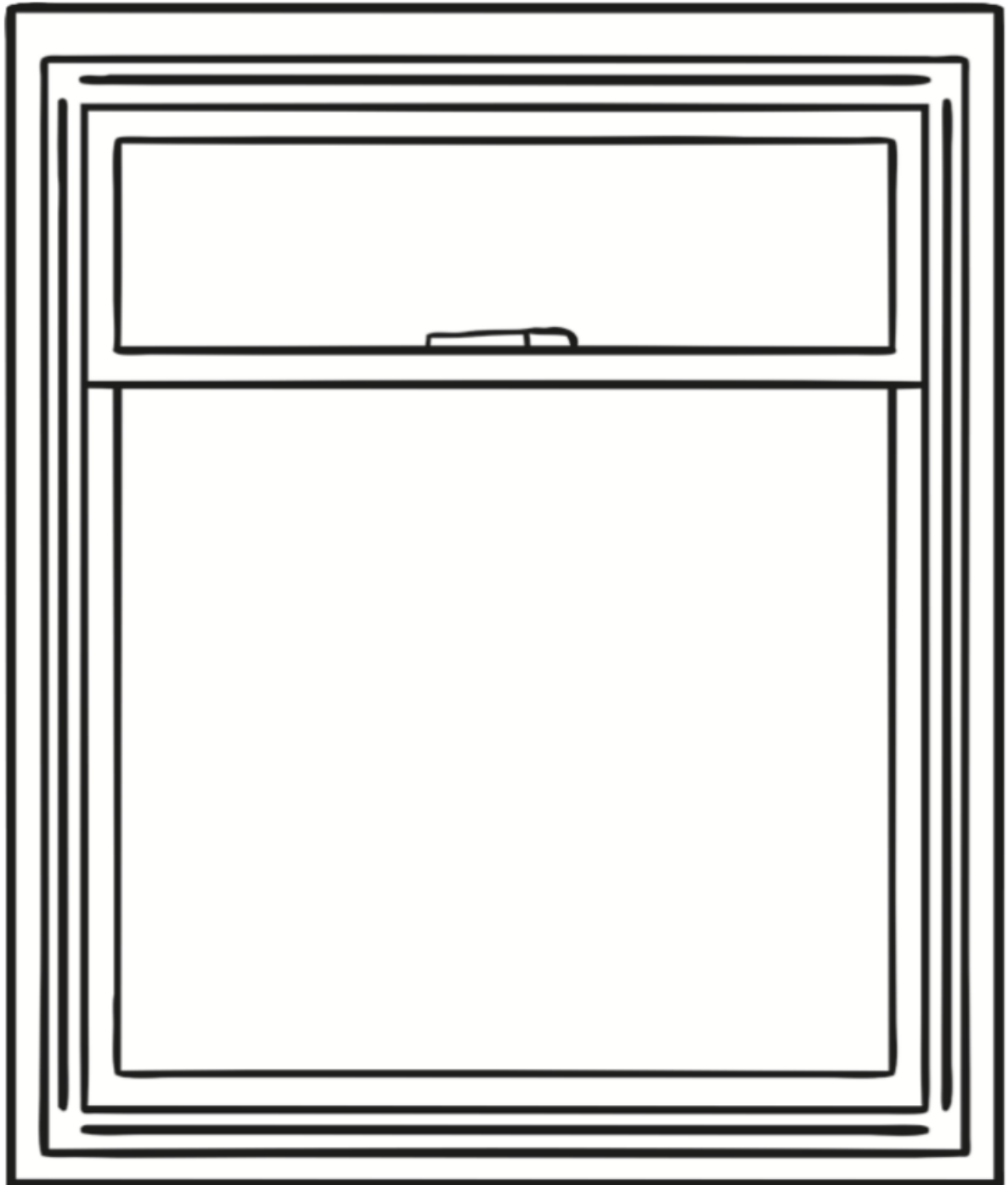
When all the plants are in, lightly water them. Now you can add your animals and use some pebbles, marbles for decoration. Then find a great place to display your brilliant indoor jungle. *Roarr-some!*

Be creative! Have fun!

Top tip: Remember to water your jungle whenever the soil gets dry!

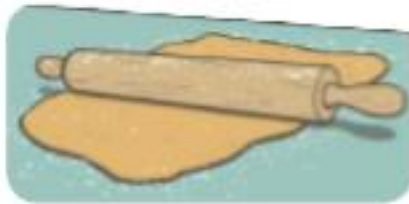
