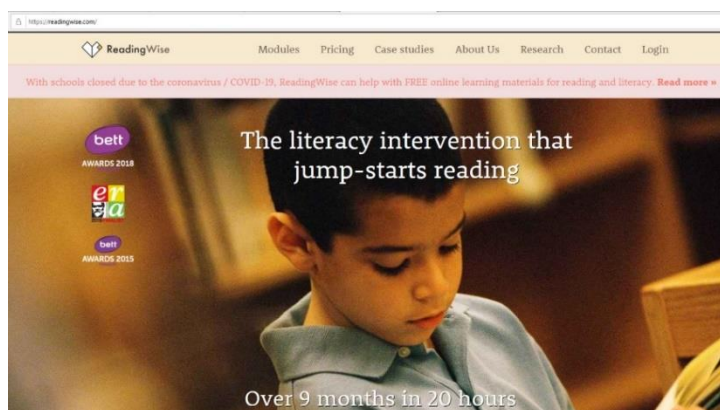


English – Reading

Listen to the story 'The Elves and the Shoemaker' then answer the following questions.

English – Reading – I Spy

Play this game with a partner. Pick an animal from the list, but don't tell your partner which one – keep it to yourself. Your partner must read the questions to you to answer, to help them work out which one you have picked. How many questions does it take to correctly guess the answer for different animals chosen? Swap over so you both get a turn at asking and answering.

Support students to read the questions carefully and accurately.



1.   Can it fly?
2.    Has it got scaly skin?
3.   Does it have a fur coat?
4.    Has it got 4 legs?
5.   Does it have a tail?
6.     Is it brown (or red or orange)?


