



Register of Pecuniary Interests October 2020

It is important that anyone responsible for spending public money does so in the way that brings the greatest benefit to the organisation that they serve, regardless of any personal interest. To demonstrate that they do not benefit personally from the decisions they make and to avoid any conflicts of interest between public and personal interest, all Governors and any staff members with significant financial or spending powers are required to declare any financial interests they have in any organisation or with individuals from whom the school may purchase goods or services.

All members of the Governing Board and staff where appropriate, are required to complete an annual declaration of their financial and pecuniary interests. This declaration must also include business interests of relatives such as parents, spouses, co-habitees or business partners where influence *could* be exerted by that person over a Governor or a member of staff or where the Governor or staff member could benefit directly or indirectly from a transaction with the School. Governors and staff must ensure that their declarations are kept up to date by amending or updating them whenever any change occurs. Governors should notify the Clerk to the Governors and the School's Business Manager of all changes. These declarations will be recorded in a register of interests, which is open to public inspection.

The intention of declaring interests is not to prevent transactions with connected parties as such, but to ensure that decisions are taken by Governors or School staff in full knowledge of individual interests and that the rules for dealing with connected parties are applied. These rules include a provision that a connected party dealing with a school may only supply goods or services at cost to themselves and must not make any profit from the transaction.

The information to be disclosed is set out on the attached declaration form. Any Governor or staff member who is unsure whether an interest exists should consult the Clerk to Governors.

Governors must declare any interests and withdraw whenever they are relevant to matters being discussed by the Governing Board or a committee. Where a member of the Governing Board has declared an interest, they may not attend the part of any meeting where a conflict of interest may arise.

In addition to the above, the [Amendment to School Governance Regulations 2015](#) instructs governing boards to publish information about their members. From 1 September 2015, governing boards must publish their register of interests. The register should set out the relevant business interests of governors and details of any other educational establishments they govern. The register should also set out any relationships between governors and members of the school staff including spouses, partners and relatives
