

Cognition and Learning

This unit fosters cognitive development through interactive play and real-life tasks, building skills like matching, sequencing, cause and effect, and problem-solving. Tailored to each student's developmental stage and sensory needs, it enhances attention, memory, and independence by applying strategies such as remembering steps and making choices. Through structured, hands-on activities with visual supports and repetition, students develop practical thinking skills in meaningful, accessible ways.

Physical and Sensory

This unit supports students in developing imitation, motor skills, and body awareness through sensory-rich activities. It promotes turn-taking, concentration, and hand-eye coordination using mirroring games, guided movements, and partner routines. Activities build self-awareness, social engagement, and foundational communication skills.

Communication and Interaction

This unit develops letter, number, and name recognition through play-based, multi-sensory learning. Students build literacy, expand vocabulary, and use communication methods like speech, sign, or AAC to express needs and preferences. The unit fosters independence, confidence, and meaningful interactions with peers, staff, and the wider community.

Social, Emotional and Mental Health

This unit helps students build emotional awareness and confidence by expressing feelings and recognising others' emotions through visuals, language, and routines. Students will practice strategies like taking breaks or asking for help, fostering resilience and self-management. The focus is on supporting wellbeing and promoting readiness for learning and social interactions.
